




## A Message from the Mayor

It was an honour and privilege to be elected Mayor of Liskeard. Previous Mayors have said the same, but we would not be able to fulfil the role without the support of our dedicated office staff and Town Clerk, and fellow councillors. We are one big team with the Mayor as captain.

I am only halfway through my mayoral year which has been incredibly busy. The Town Council has just agreed new Aims until 2021, following consultation at St Matthews fair, and will now draw up a plan to achieve them.

We recently agreed to financially support Young People Cornwall with their Liskeard Youth Work, enabling them to continue valuable work to support 11-19 year olds, providing an open access youth centre at the Liskerrett Centre. This offers a safe space for young people to meet, receive information, advice and guidance on a wide range of issues and access a range of positive activities designed to build their personal and social development.

The Liskeard draft Neighbourhood Development Plan has moved a step closer to becoming 'made' in law, with a Cornwall Council consultation just finishing. In the New Year there will be a referendum, and if accepted it will become a valuable planning document until 2030. It has been driven by community volunteers, supported by the Town Council, and we are indebted to them for their hard work.

Liskeard in Bloom has won several awards this year (more details on p6) and are now planning for next year. To kick-start funding, volunteers ran a charity shop for a week which raised



£437.50. Look out for another early next year.

I enjoyed welcoming people to the Mayor's Parlour and Council Chamber during Liskeard Unlocked in September, and thank all the local organisations who worked together to stage this wonderful free event.

These are just a few examples of the people and organisations in Liskeard working together to achieve great things.

The Lions are now busy rehearsing for their annual pantomime, and we all look forward to seeing it in January.

This year for the Mayor's charity I am supporting our primary schools, Hillfort and St Martin's, together with the Next Step Liskeard Stroke Club where my husband Terry and I volunteer.

I hope many of you will join me at the Mayor's Candlelit Carol Service at the Methodist Church on Sunday 17th December at 6pm, being broadcast live on Liskeard Radio.

Finally, Terry and I would like to send you all best wishes for Christmas and the New Year.



**Liskeard in Bloom** 

Liskeard in Bloom was launched in March, by the then Mayor of Liskeard, Councillor Jane Pascoe. Building on the success of the previous year's awardwinning displays in Fore Street, the Mayor asked town centre businesses to make space for a hanging basket, window box or tub of flowers.

Managed by the Liskeard Town Forum, it now involves many organisations and volunteers.

They have filled the town centre with flowers, enhancing the main highway through the town, welcoming visitors and delighting the eye. This has won awards, including a South West in Bloom Gold Award for Best Town Centre. At the South East Cornwall in Bloom Awards, Liskeard scooped four



awards for Best Market Town, Best Café, Best Retail and the Best Overall Winner.

Hundreds of hours of volunteer time have pulled off the unimaginable. The town looked amazing.


I was very excited to be Father Christmas for the Liskeard Community Action Christmas party in 2016 and hope to reprise that role if my beard grows in time!

#### HIRE THE PUBLIC HALL

The Public Hall Complex, situated at 3-5 West Street, is available for hire for a wide variety of commercial and social events. It can accommodate conferences, dances, meetings, wedding receptions, birthday parties, fayres, anniversary celebrations, concerts and shows.

**Main Hall:** seating capacity 300, disabled access from Barras Place. Loop system, lighting, sound, large screen (20'  $\times$  10'). Hire charges from £71 per session.

Refreshment Room: seating capacity 60, with kitchen. Hire charge £18.

New Liskeard Room: seating capacity 40, with kitchenette. Hire charge £17.

Quimperle Room: seating capacity 40, with kitchenette. Hire charge £17.

Long Room: seating capacity 60, with kitchen & loop system. Hire charge £18.

**Council Chamber:** for formal meetings, seating capacity 30, with loop system. *Hire charge £17*.
