**Narrative:****Adult committee:**

The committee have continued to work on the Children In Need bid to be submitted on a future submission date once ready.

The committee met to discuss finances, and with funding now being gained direct to the Lyskerrys youth committee, it has been decided and agreed that the town council funding will be passed on to the Lyskerrys youth committee to manage directly.

The AGM has been planned for November 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Youth club:**

Lyskerrys youth club remains to have a good attendance with over 30 members attending weekly, and new members joining continuously.

During sessions we have continued to facilitate music lessons within the group through a local volunteer, we also have planned activities such as a games night, a pamper session, and had a town councillor in to make bracelets. Young people took part in the #worldwidesmile campaign for world mental health day, writing down what makes them smile.

We ran a trip to Alton towers, this was facilitated through Young People Cornwall, 10 young people from Liskeard joined other youth groups from across Cornwall to go on this 24hr trip to the theme park.

Young people took part and had their voices heard through voting in the Make Your Mark campaign for youth parliament.

Two young people were awarded timebanking credits to access their local gym, they had earned these credits by doing voluntary hours through the youth club and in the community, the scheme was run by Volunteer Cornwall.

We had contact with Sarah who is joining the local police force and wanted to look into the different activities happening in the area, she came along to a session, and we are arranging that she attend in the future to do a talk on ASB.

Further future sessions we have arranged for Brook Sexual health and LGBT+ to deliver a session each in Nov, young people are planning a community Halloween party through their small grants funding.

Following on from the successful summer food programme, we are arranging free food for young people to eat when they come in on a Friday if they are hungry. The Food Bank and Real Junk food are supplying some food. Co-op continue to give us donations too.

We are co-ordinating for one young person from the youth club to take part in youth takeover day at the end of November.

Youth workers continue to attend local meetings including Safer Liskeard, and worked with them to do some outreach work in an area that was having ASB issues.
