To prepare and submit an outline planning permission application for the development of the enterprise including a community hub building. The Community Capacity Grant will fund the above and will enable us to clarify and quantify our business proposition and put us in a stronger position to access funding to deliver our final project.

14	Please describe the 'final' project that you hope to deliver.	We have purchased an 8-acre site. Our vision is for a thriving and diverse community farm, collaborating with local people to create a strong local economy and social connection. The farm will create a regenerative land-based enterprise centre, consisting of three main elements: the land, outbuildings (workshops) and a community farm hub building. The hub will offer a place for education and learning, not only as an example of innovative green building techniques but a space for sharing the learning from Tregovenek. Renting the space will also provide an income stream for Tregovenek. We aim to directly create employment and training opportunities in rural skills and also provide facilities for small businesses. We aim to bring in inward investment to our locality and build skills for community action.

We are working with Plymouth University to use the farm as a research base (see section 15) and an educational resource for our local primary school.

We aim to become a model and inspiration for other communities to explore and learn about local food security, supporting community resilience, resource sustainability, strong local economies and social connection.

Tregovenek will be an exemplar of community action and regenerative agriculture for those inspired to change how they live, work together, farm, grow food and manage their land.

We will create opportunities for entrants to rural businesses in a supportive environment. Our vision for Tregovenek is to be a place where people can learn about regenerative livelihoods, including learning practical skills.

Tregovenek is a CBS which means that everyone involved will have the opportunity to be a member and have a say in how it is run. The people at the core of Tregovenek are experienced community builders, place-leaders and facilitators, and have been sharing their skills with training in community engagement, communication and decision-making skills with people involved with the CBS.

This reduces the funding we are requesting from £20,788.44 to £15,814.44 including VAT.
