Councillor Whitty proposed, Councillor J. Shrubsole seconded and the Committee **RESOLVED** to **RECOMMEND** that the Council **SUPPORT** the application.

## PA15/04917 - Mr & Mrs N. Fry, 6 Allen Vale

Following discussion Councillor Hodgkins proposed, The Mayor seconded and the Committee **RESOLVED** to **RECOMMEND** that the Council **SUPPORT** the application.

The Chairman of the Committee, the Deputy Mayor, had declared an interest in the following item and left the meeting at 7.05 pm.

## PA15/03888 - J. D. Wetherspoon, Taylors Garage, Barras Street

Listed Building consent for the proposed demolition of disused fuel station and associated buildings and construction of new public house development (A4 use) and associated works.

## **CORRESPONDENCE**

The Town Clerk read out a letter received from the Stuart House Trust in which they had supported the development of the site but had concerns about the design, street scene and operational matters. They also provided a copy of correspondence from Historic England and asked that the opinion of Historic England be also incorporated in the final proposals.

## **PUBLIC SPEAKER**

Mr. Burt representing J. D. Wetherspoon's replied to comments made;

- Discussions had been had with Stuart House and some agreements made, the rear wooden boundary fence would now be constructed of brickwork
- The access between the buildings had been widened and a gate would be fitted
- The rubbish bins would have sealed covers
   In the proposed design the high roof level was set well back from the frontage

The link to Stuart House was founded on piers, it was not structurally attached.

Councillors were reminded that this application was for Listed Building Consent only, they had to consider the impact of the proposal on the Listed Buildings in the area.

The Liskeard Neighbourhood Plan Town Working Group had held a simple public consultation between 23 May and 3 June, both on-line and in person; the general comments were in favour of the development with some caveats. Details of this consultation are attached to these minutes.

Members comments included;

- The proposal overshadowed Stuart House, it was too high and too close
- It was too close to the pavement
- The design was not sympathetic with the surroundings
- The quality of the views to Stuart House would be spoilt
- How would the demolition take place to not affect Stuart House
- A Mansard style roof could be incorporated
- There was a discussion on the subjectivity of architectural design with concern that the new building should not be a pastiche or mock interpretation.

Councillor Hodgkins proposed, Councillor Whitty seconded and the Committee **RESOLVED** to **RECOMMEND** that the Council **SUPPORT** the application on the condition that the concerns of Stuart House and the views of Historic England were addressed, and the Conservation Officer supported the application.

The Deputy Mayor was asked to rejoin the meeting at 7.35 pm.
