The committee met and discussed future funding and finalised partner agreement with YPC.

**Youth club:**

Members are rising with new young people joining each week. We currently have around 37 regular young people attend, with numbers fluctuating occasionally.

Session activities this month have included cooking sessions, making cakes and pasta bake, arts and craft, with some great donations! As well as wii dance offs (focus on healthy activities)

We have had local PCSO Steve attend to introduce himself and he will be dropping in as and when.

Music lessons continue to be facilitated by a volunteer and are regularly attended and enjoyed by young people.

Young People Cornwall community development worker attended a meeting at Liskerrett regarding the cattle market development, to promote the youth group and young peoples voice within the development, we will look to continue to take part and encourage young people to take part in the consultations around this.

**Future plans include:**

Brook sexual health are booked for a March session. We encourage different professionals to attend sessions to talk about their specialist projects as well as continue to train Youth workers on various topics for example Karen did her C-Card practitioner training this month.

Youth workers are in talks with a local forest school, to get the youth club outside in the summer (also a qualified forest school practitioner)

A new steering group is being developed (new members replacing the old members)

We have booked to take part in the Liskeard community fair in March.

**Narrative:**

**Adult committee:**

The committee did not meet this month as there was a double booking issue for the meeting space. Work continued on a children in need bid and running of youth group.

**Youth club:**

We have lots of new members who joined in Feb. The 11-13 yr old session now has 39 regular members. Most of whom attend weekly (27) and others that attend at least fortnightly.

There are 42 regular 14-18 yr olds who attend weekly or fortnightly.

Feb has been a full month of a variety of cooking and arts and crafts session aswell as going over club rules and boundaries, for our newer members.

We have a new volunteer who helps with cooking/baking with the younger group. (level 2 food hygiene) this means we have 4 volunteers who continue to volunteer regularly.

We have a member of the youth club who is now the Deputy Youth Member of Parliament, she was voted in by young people from schools and colleges. She has attended local council events, with Cllr Sally Hawkin.

We now have a new members in the steering group and the first session went well, with new fundraising ideas, in order to buy ingredients for the healthy eating sessions.

The music room is used weekly with Dan our music volunteer giving guitar, drum and singing lessons to both age groups.

We have done a consultation questionnaire with young people which allows us to get young peoples feedback on what they get out of youth sessions, results are attached separately.

Sessions planned for March/April include Headstart, Wellbeing yoga, Brook, WyZup and Freetestme.

We will be promoting the youth club at the Liskeard community fair on 30<sup>th</sup> March.
