**Cornwall Councillor Report Liskeard South and Dobwalls - Councillor Jane Pascoe - Cattle Market Car Park – Season/ Resident parking permits.**

Further to my discussions with the Head of Car Parks following residents contacting me, I can confirm that residents who had previously had a permit in the Cattle Market and may have been moved to Westbourne – during the construction work will be allowed to apply for a permit in Westbourne Car Park when they need to renew.

The problem had occurred due to the change to the Cattle Market Car Park becoming “Short Term” and the Cornwall Council Policy that short term car parks do not qualify for permits.

**Public Realm Weed Treatment** – You will see at Agenda Item 14 that a motion to Pause the commencement of chemical weed treatment until a meaningful public consultation process has been completed, came before members at Cornwall Council last Tuesday. It was a long debate and not only about the chemical substance but also about the way the Parish Councils were given short notice and after they had set their receipts. It was agreed that this was an unacceptable way to treat our Parishes who work hard for the County.

The motion was passed.

I have received complaints about the unkempt state of the gateway to Liskeard via Plymouth Road. The roundabouts have broken fences and old banners. Can the Town Council help?

The South East Cornwall Community Area Partnership meeting held at St Pinnock Band and Community Hall in East Taphouse was well attended. St Pinnock Band gave an excellent presentation and outlined the music academy which encourages young people to come along and try out an instrument and learn to play.

Representatives from the 29 Parishes swapped copies of Parsh newsletters/magazines and they discussed how helpful these publications were informing and connecting with residents. Updates were also received re: A38, Tamar Crossings.

CHIP -Highway improvement plan scheme – 33 projects were submitted and on the 16th April these were reviewed by Cllrs and the Highway Manager. Cost and technical details will now be considered and we hope to achieve as many as possible on the list.

I am part of the working group for the new Cornwall Local Plan and information is being gathered strategically. It is important the plan acknowledges the important and essential infrastructure for SE Cornwall across the river in Plymouth such as Health care, Employment, Education and Leisure .I also attended a meeting with the CC lead officers, initially discussing the structure within the MOU to include the offer of SE Cornwall for transport, employment/ skills, housing and leisure. We identify this as a timely opportunity to promote the area and to attract inward investment.

I was unable to attend the launch of the pottery by our first tenant in the newly refurbished units , but I visited her yesterday and wish her every success in her new venture in Liskeard. Construction work is reaching a conclusion, the ISHub has some internal technical work to complete and the bus terminal will soon be operational.

Liskeard and District Twinning Association. – A visit has been arranged by the Liskeard Chess Club with Quimperle Chess Club. They will be welcoming 9 visitors, 2 adults and 7 young people from Quimperle on 7th – 9th May.
