



Project Proposal

For Liskeard Town Council

Liskeard in Bloom is a Community Regeneration Project with charitable aims, and was established in February 2017. Our main objective is to improve the town's appearance by the use of flower displays. We will do this by working with, and supporting our diverse communities to achieve this aim. We are delighted to have been given the opportunity to work alongside the town council and businesses in the Cattle Market to support the regeneration of this area.

This note sets out our proposals for the area, together with corresponding information and decisions that we will need to progress them:

Proposal	What we need to progress
Installation of 6x 1m high concrete planters to separate out the new trading area from the remaining car park. We have a local building company that has offered to donate these items to us.	 What is the earliest date for installation? We need to liaise between our volunteers and the supplying company. What is the dividing line between the two areas? So that we give instructions to the building company for delivery. What gap is needed between the planters to allow for movement of people, wheelchairs etc. So that easy and free movement for people is allowed whilst preventing vehicles from driving through.
LIB will plant out tall shrubs, seasonal flowers in the tubs and Christmas wreaths at the entrances. <i>This will be a donation from LIB and is</i> <i>supported by residual funding we received</i> <i>from the High Street Heroes grant we</i> <i>received earlier this year. We will be</i> <i>working with Cattle Market businesses to</i> <i>encourage them to maintain the tubs.</i>	What is the final date for preparations to be complete? So that we can schedule our volunteers to carry out planting alongside their other commitments in the town centre.
LIB is negotiating to have a tall Christmas tree donated by a local supplier. We had been promised this tree earlier this year, and given that The Parade and Fore Street will have their own trees, we will contribute this tree to the Cattle Market.	Whose agreement and consent do we need to install the tree? We would like to locate the tree so that it can be seen by people walking along Market Approach. Ideally, this along the wall adjacent to David Hambly Photography and will not obscure his windows.

We may be able to arrange a donation of tree lights. <i>Electricity supply agreed by Soap Shop</i> Tree will need decorations. <i>We will be asking Cattle Market businesses</i> <i>to be responsible for supply of decorations</i> <i>and dressing the tree.</i>	
Clean up of Cattle Market entrances The walk-in entrance of Market Approach and drive-in entrance at Fairpark Road need weeding and rubbish removing.	Can the town council persuade residents/Liskerrett Centre to provide volunteers to carry out the clean-up? LIB can supervise.
Beyond Christmas, LIB will supply each business in the market space with a small (30cm) tub of seasonal and spring flowers. The cost of these tubs will be met from HSH grant. Businesses will be responsible for maintaining the plants. We will encourage and support businesses to create their own floral displays.
