3/24 ELECTION OF A MAYOR FOR 2024/2025 – The Mayor Councillor Simon Cassidy nominated, Councillor Nick Craker seconded the nomination and the Council **RESOLVED** to elect Councillor Christina Whitty as Mayor for the 2024/2025 year.

Having been elected, the Mayor, Councillor Christina Whitty, took the Oath of Allegiance signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and received the Maces.

The new Mayor then appointed Daniel Keddle (who was not present) as Town Sergeant of Mace. She then appointed Miss Rose Ramwell and Mr Ethan Mort as Mace Bearers for 2024/2025 and returned the Maces to them.

Theresa Conway, Officer in Charge of the Citadel (who was not present), was appointed the Mayors' Chaplain.

4/24 ELECTION OF A DEPUTY MAYOR FOR 2024/2025 – Councillor Lori Reid nominated, and Councillor Tracy Adams seconded the nomination and the Council **RESOLVED** to elect Councillor Julian Smith as Deputy Mayor for the 2024/2025 year.

Not being present the Oath of Allegiance and the Declaration of the Acceptance of Office would be signed later.

The Town Clerk announced an interval whilst the Mayoral Procession retired for robing and photographs. During the interval the “I Thought I Couldn’t Sing” choir sang a number of songs to the audience.

5/24 RETIRING MAYOR – SPEECH AND PRESENTATIONS – “Becoming Mayor was the greatest honour of my life. 6/24 ACCEPTANCE SPEECH BY THE MAYOR – “Distinguished guests, honoured burgess, ladies and gentlemen, family and friends. Thank you for joining us tonight at our Mayor Choosing Ceremony. Another year, another Mayor Choosing, where has the time gone?

A lot has happened in the past year. We saw the Worksheds in the Cattle Market completed and now in the building businesses are starting to take up the rooms and the hot desking is very popular. The twice weekly markets on Saturday are also very popular and there are plans for other events to be held in the canopy such as this year’s Lions carnival and St Matthew’s Fair as well as others.

The number of houses being built or completed over the year has grown which has meant an increase in our population and there are plans for ever more houses. As a Council we work very closely with our partners Cornwall Council, Cormac, Chamber of Commerce, Town Traders, Wainhomes and Persimmon and in doing so we hope to make Liskeard a better place for our residents to live and work and raise their families.

Our Council is working with Cornwall Council at the moment on the development of our Cattle Market. Work has started on phase 2 which is the Integrated Hub and hopefully in the near future the work on the doctors extension and the bus terminal will begin.

We are also nearing the completion of taking over the running of Castle Park from Cornwall Council which has been a devolution project that has taken our Facilities team, lead by Councillor Julian Smith, my Deputy Mayor and Jacqui Orange, our Facilities Manager, quite some time.

Last year we had our Public Hall toilets refurbished and this year we have plans to refurbish the Guildhall as well as looking to refurbish our Skatepark in Rapsons. ~Some of our councillors visited the new one in Millbrook and were very impressed with it and when they reported back to Council they said “lets have one like that”. Of course, some of these projects take time to work on and may take 2-3 years before they are completed, but if they are within our power we have a dedicated group of councillors who will work extremely hard to try and make things happen.

Of course, our Council can’t function without the support of our staff headed by our Town Clerk, Steve, who keeps us all on our toes. Yvette, our Assistant Town Clerk and RFO, Trudy, Mandy and Zoe who work extremely hard in the office. Then we have Jacqui and her team who maintain our buildings, toilets, Thorn Park, Rapsons and our other facilities.

During the year several events are put on in the town, some by the Town Council. The Liskeard Lights up is organised by Councillor Brooks along with other Councillors and last year we had new lights for our town. We also had a wonderful display of new trees and lights which were supplied by one of our fellow Councillors, Daivid Braithwaite. The lantern parade returned following a gap due to Covid, all of which was enjoyed by our residents. In September we have our Liskeard Unlocked. This is lead by Councillor Brooks. Each year we have a different theme and some of our historic buildings are opened to the public to view. We also have some historic walks lead by one of our town Burgess, Brian Oldham. This year’s theme is cooperation and twinning and work is well under way.

On the topic of twinning, last year we had the Mayor and Deputy Mayor of our twin town, Quimperle visit us and next week Liskeard & Looe Girls Rugby team are going to Quimperle for a tournament. Our Council gave them some funding towards this trip. Our twinning relationship lapsed for a few years, but, Simon through a lot of hard work has started up relationships again. He has also been working with a town in Ukraine which we are now twinned with. Since December he has been travelling monthly with Callington Lions and other volunteers to take much needed aid to Poland for the people of Ukraine and he will be carrying on this role and is on his next journey, leaving this Saturday and we wish him a safe journey.

I have some very special guests here tonight. Please could they stand. These are some of the Royal Naval veterans who work along side the staff at HMS Raleigh. They give their time voluntarily to work with the new recruits who join the Navy and their wealth of knowledge helps the new recruits make it to week 10 when they pass out and join the Fleet and become part of our Navy which protects our country. Terry, my husband, is the lead mentor with 19 other mentors working alongside him.

It is an honour and great privilege to be elected again to serve as Mayor of Liskeard and I would like to thank Simon and my fellow Councillors for their continued support. Simon will be a hard act to follow and shoes to fill. He tells me he wears a size 15, so very big shoes, but I will do my very best for the Council and the town that I love so very much.

I will carry on with all my charity work, such as Chairman of the Memory Café, Lions, members Secretary for the RNA, Committee member for the RBL as well as all the other committees I support. Simon and I could go on talking for hours, but some of you have travelled some distance so we don't want you to miss your pasty and glass of wine, so I am going to finish by saying Thank You one and all"
