The Town Council will make the ferry booking for the Town Clerk, Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Councillor Cassidy, travelling as foot passengers on the evening of 18 September with two cabins. Approximate cost - foot passengers £42 each return (£168) plus cabins (£144) = total £312.

Quimperlé can arrange discounted coach travel for eight from the ferry port (cost awaited). Separate arrangements will be made to travel from Liskeard to the ferry port in Plymouth.

Accommodation – Quimperlé are trying to provide everyone with accommodation for the duration of the trip with families and friends and hosts.

Suitable gifts will be required for the Mayor and Deputy Mayor of Quimperlé and hosts.

Subsistence based on the Cornwall Council Members' Allowances Scheme (2024/25):

- Breakfast £8.26
- Lunch £12.45
- Evening Meal £17.80
- Accommodation with relatives or friends £34.70

Interpretation and translation costs – details awaited (on the last visit travel expenses from Belgium £467 and some subsistence were paid).

Other proposed activities:

A return visit from a party from Quimperlé with an event to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the twinning, possibly to coincide with another town event such as St Matthews Fair or Remembrance Day. Ideas for this to Councillor Cassidy.

To invite the Mayor of Kopychyntsi to visit the town towards the end of the year, possibly to link with the Nadelik Lyskerrys celebrations.
