- 3) Build on the improved accessibility at the Public Hall to work with other to promote inclusivity and accessibility in Liskeard

A Dementia Friends training session was held on Friday 28 February. It was delivered by Jane Milligan from Job Centre + and attended by 19 people including 5 town council staff, interested local people and representatives from local businesses who Jane hopes may also consider signing up to Disability Confident. The training was well received, and feedback is being collected.

- 4) Promote walking and cycling in and around Liskeard, including reviewing and improving signage and establishing new trails

Cycle Stands - Cornwall Council have agreed to provide three new cycle stands on the Webb's House side of the Parade. The existing cycle stand outside Lloyds Bank is to be left in place as it provides an additional facility on the other side of the traffic flow, however if damaged it will be removed and the area repaired but not replaced. There is therefore no need for the Town Council to purchase a granite bollard.

Services plans for Fore Street show cabling/pipes in the areas where there may be sufficient space for cycle stands.

Wetherspoons have been contacted about provision of cycle parking within their curtilage. While they would not fund this, they would be happy to give permission for it to be installed on the land.

- 5) Develop a Community Emergency Plan

Cornwall Council have been contacted to arrange for the plan to be submitted for testing and we are awaiting their response.

9. Budget Monitoring

While staff salaries appear to be a little overspent, across the three salary related lines (salary, NI and Pension) they are within budget with a total spend of £33,100 against a budget of £41,015 (81%).
