

## **8. VACANCIES ON THE PLANNING PARTNERSHIP – To consider the Cornwall Association of Local Council's (CALC) notification of a vacancy on the Planning Partnership**

Background – Sarah Mason at CALC has contacted CALC members to inform them of a vacancy as per the text below and the two attachments.

“The Cornwall Planning Partnership was established in September 2015 to bring together representatives from parish and town councils and representatives from the Planning Service including the portfolio holder, to discuss matters relating the delivery of an effective planning service in Cornwall. Members of the Planning Partnership attend in their own right, they are there to comment and influence the delivery of the planning system in Cornwall and give a local perspective of the impact of any changes in the service.

There now exists two vacancies on the forum – one member and one clerk or another member of staff who handles planning matters. The partnership is inviting written applications via email with a maximum of 250 words outlining your interest and experience in planning and development. The term of office is until after the elections in May 2017. I am aware that there has been a lot of interest in the work of this partnership and that the vacancies are likely to be oversubscribed. The final selection will be made by the parish and town council representatives on the partnership and announced shortly afterwards.

Please find attached the terms of reference and the role profile for the partnership. I would be very grateful if you would circulate these to your members and encourage applications. Nominations must be received by October 5th, 2016 and supported by your council.”

**RECOMMENDATION: That the Committee considers whether to make application in regards this vacancy.**

## **9. OCEAN HOUSING STREET NAMING – To consider the request from Ocean Housing to supply up to three names for their development.**

Background – Ocean Housing require a street name for their new development. They have requested that we supply them with up to three in case of issues with the Street Naming and Numbering authority Cornwall Council. Attached is a list last updated in May 2015 of prospective street names.

Councillors are asked to bear in mind that Cornwall Council's street naming policy includes not to use the names of people for street names.

**RECOMMENDATION: That up to three names are selected for supply to Ocean Housing.**
