**Subject:** Land at Addington - reserved matters application for phase 4 under reference PA18/11093 Persimmon Homes and any other Persimmon applications in Liskeard

**Correspondence for Liskeard Town Council Planning Committee**

We would entreat the Council not to support Persimmon's reserved matters application for phase 4 (PA/11093) - and any other Persimmon applications in Liskeard - unless and until the developer has actually completed all that it agreed to do in earlier phases of the Trevethan Meadow development and which were enshrined in the planning permission. We can provide further details and documentation in due course but in brief, two Cornish hedges with attendant planting and fencing have not been constructed. These hedges were designed, at least in part, to plan out crime and anti-social behaviour. We are experiencing trespass and petty vandalism through one of the areas where a hedge and fences were supposed to be constructed. Yesterday the developer agreed to put up a temporary fence this morning. It has not done so. Planning Enforcement at Cornwall Council are aware of the issues. They have not advised that they are actually doing anything.

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
