In 2019/2020 the Council managed261,022 tonnes of waste and recycling


That's 941kg per household


What you can recycle



- Due to our kerbside separation systems we recycle +99% of the material we collect

What's in the black bag?



Can be recycled on kerbside: 21.75%

Food waste: 35.15%

Over 50% of black bag waste can be recycled

Garden Waste Collection



Fortnightly collection on the alternate week to your recycling collection

- Grass cuttings
- Leaves or organic sweepings
- Tree, shrub and rose prunings
- Branches (<30cm long and 2.5cm diameter)</p>
- Cut flowers
- Weeds
- Windfall

Disposing of personal waste if you or anyone in your home has coronavirus symptoms or has received a positive test:

- Double bag personal waste: cleaning cloths, tissues and disposable face coverings
- Put waste aside for 72 hours before putting out with regular waste
- Other household waste can be disposed of as normal


Recycling on the go

- New waste contract provision for on-street litter recycling
- Work will commence designing and procuring from 1st February
- Evidence gathering including container types, locations, priority of sites, litter volumes, timeline
- Rolling out over first year of contract
- Trial has run in St Ives contamination
