Subject: Footway to the front of King Doniert Pub, Barras Street, Liskeard.

Dear Mr Vinson / Liskeard Town Council,

Please find attached Cornwall Councils plans for the area to the front of the King Doniert Pub, Liskeard on which I invite your comment.

As can be seen from the attached we plan to:

- Renew the paving throughout this area removing the former fuel station access and egress in the process.
- Install bollards between the parking bay to the front of the library and the roundabout to prevent vehicles from mounting the footway
- Reclaim the full area that was highway prior to the development
- Widen the footway to the side of Kivells
- Remove the railing and sign clutter adjacent to the above and replace with rationalized signage (Sign design TBC)
- Use reclaimed granite kerbs – we aim to match those used elsewhere on Barras Street
- Use stone effect concrete paving (400mm x 400mm 65mm thick Marshalls Saxon Charcoal) – similar to but not the same as that used elsewhere on Barras street as this is no longer available

We plan to carry out these works this Autumn, when I have exact dates I will write again to advise.

I would welcome a meeting with you to discuss the scheme. Should you wish to meet please can you provide suitable dates & times from your perspective?
