114 / 25 ACTIVE TRAVEL – To receive verbal feedback from the meeting on Wednesday 9 July 2025

Cornwall Council have been granted Consolidated Active Travel Funding (CATF) for 2025/26 of which the largest share of £600,000 has been allocated to Liskeard for improvements to route 1 of the LCWIP from the railway station to the double mini roundabouts at Addington. It is currently going through final internal approvals and will also need to go through Active Travel England's scheme assurance assessment.

At the same time, Cornwall Council are looking to use some of the S106 funding on Charter Way to start delivery of route 4. They will be focusing on the northern end of Charter Way and delivering a coherent section of the wider route, linking into Pengover Road where the one-way restriction is currently in place.

They anticipate design and consultation in 2025/26 and construction in 2026/27 to complete well in advance of the March 2027 deadline. A press release will be issued once final approvals are in place.

115 / 25 TWINNING - To receive an update from the planning meeting on Wednesday 18 June 2025

It was suggested that for the proposed visit to Quimperlé in September 2025 the Town Council would pay the costs for the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Town Clerk, and official meals. The budget for previous twinning gifts has usually been approx. £100 but as this is the 50th anniversary this could be increased to £150 from the Civic Duty budget. Suggestions included framed drawings of the town by a local artist to complement the previous one given in 2023, and a plaque relating to the mining heritage of the area.

The Mayor was requested to invite the Mayor of Kopychyntsi to visit later in the year to enable him to apply for a visa.

An item would be added to the next agenda to discuss adding 'Twinned with Kopychyntsi' to the four 'Welcome to Liskeard' signs at the entrances to the town.
