

LISKEARD CATTLE MARKET MAKERS PROJECT

ARTS AND CRAFTS AFTER SCHOOL CLUB LEADER ROLE DESCRIPTION

The project

The Cattle Market Makers project will provide small workshops and shared space in a new creative hub. There will be business and other support for craftspeople and makers and opportunities to try new crafts for those just starting out.

One important strand of the project is engaging with people who have not worked for some time, who can take part in creative and craft activities to boost their skills and confidence as steps towards education, job search or self-employment.

The project is led by Liskeard Town Council, working in partnership with Cornwall Council and Plymouth College of Arts and funded by the Community Led Local Development (CLLD) fund, which brings together EU funding which supports business with funds to help people who are economically inactive.

The after school clubs

The aim of the clubs is to encourage parents and grandparents to make craft with their children, to build confidence and introduce them to what the Cattle Market Makers project can offer.

The clubs will be based in local primary schools, and it is hoped to start them from mid November 2021. There will be weekly 1.5 hour term-time sessions, four in the autumn term, starting in mid November, and at least eight in the spring and summer terms.

The role

We are looking for enthusiastic individuals who are passionate about working with children and adults and have experience of designing and delivering art and craft sessions.

You need to be:

- Organised.
- Encouraging and willing to help.
- A clear and patient communicator
- Considerate of other's safety and wellbeing
- Able to inspire others with your passion for the subject.

Duties will include:

- Designing the sessions to provide a range of accessible art and craft activities which can be done on a drop-in basis.
- Planning and costing materials needed.
- Liaising with the schools around the practicalities of access and facilities.
- Delivering creative arts and crafts sessions to primary school children and their parents and grandparents.
- Supporting participants during the creative sessions and guiding them
- Following setting up and closing down procedures and safety procedures.

Payment both for preparation and delivery: 1 hour preparation and 1.5 hours delivery for each session. As part of your learning plan please include the maximum number of adults and children that could be accommodated within the session.

Rate of pay: £30 per hour (self-employed/freelance)

Location: Liskeard

Materials: £2 has been allowed per person, per session, maximum £24 per session.

References and current DBS check will be required.
