083 / 23 **CORNWALL COUNCILLOR UPDATES** – Councillor Pascoe:

"The inaugural meeting of the new CAP, Community Area Partnership took place on the 6th June in St Germans Community Hall. Thank you to Cllr C Whitty for your attendance.

I was elected as Chairman and Hilary Frank who was the former Chair of the Gateway was elected as Vice Chairman.

It was a well-attended meeting with most of the Parishes in attendance, with representatives from Polruan to Rame peninsula.

A Funding Panel, which will consider applications for funding to the Community Levelling Up Programme and the Community Capacity Fund was formed.

Members appointed were from 3 Towns and 3 Rural Parishes. Cllr Whitty volunteered to be a member of the panel.

It was agreed to establish 3 other working groups

- Transport and Connectivity. This will include A38,A390,A388, Bus services, road safety, highways issues etc.
- Economic Growth and Development. This will include attracting investment, promoting and marketing the SE Cornwall, tourism, green tourism, vitality and viability in the towns centres and a vibrant rural economy and other issues.
- Climate Action and Nature Recovery. Previous workshop in the Gateway CNA.

We are seeking membership for these groups, and they will be confirmed at the next meeting.

It was also agreed at the meeting to support a motion to formally write to the Minister for Transport, MP for SE Cornwall and Cabinet portfolio holder to urge the DfT to reconsider the decision to postpone funding or the A38 Carkeel to Trerulefoot Safety Package

On Monday at the East Planning committee plans for a new Integrated services hub were approved.

Despite concerns from members of the public, it was confirmed that once the construction work was completed on both buildings in the cattle market site there will be a net gain of car park spaces and a traffic plan is part of the condition. Reason to ensure those working in the building park in Rapson car park and leave the popular market car park for the shoppers and visitors to the town.

Armed Forced Day took place on the 24 th & 25th June, with events to interest all ages. An occasion to thank the members of our Armed Forces past and present and an opportunity to promote Cornwall.

The portfolio holder for waste has indicated that refuse collection operatives may go into their extreme weather plan if there is a heatwave.
