Councillor Whitty nominated, Councillor Craker seconded the nomination and the Council **<u>RESOLVED</u>** to elect Councillor Simon Cassidy as Mayor for the 2022/2023 year.

4/22 ACCEPTANCE SPEECH BY THE MAYOR
