585 /22 AGENT PRESENTATION

PA23/01899, PA23/01900, PA23/01896 and PA23/01897 - Amanda Pennington and Julie-Anne Sutherland reported that Wildanet proposals included adding railings to the building to make it look more attractive and restore its pre WWII look. Other fencing would provide security for the proposed training academy, which would be backed up by evening and weekend security patrols. The purpose of the proposed signage was to add their brand to the building and help people find it. They noted the public objection regarding the illuminated sign and would accept a condition that this is turned off overnight.

The pole field would provide a training ground for their proposed training academy, which will deliver an accredited programme, written by Truro and Penwith College. Appropriate training is needed to enable staff to reach Open Reach requirements to work on the network. Staff were currently being sent to Lincoln for training, involving 260 nights away from home so far. Providing this in Liskeard would bring training to Cornwall, and economic benefit to the town with people travelling here to undertake training and staying/visiting the town centre. Should the academy fall out of use the poles would be removed. Wildanet hope to create another 200 jobs over the next three years.
