448 /24 AGENT PRESENTATION

PA25/01739 & PA25/01740 Land between Greenbank Road and Barras Place – Ivan Tomlin from Planning for Results Ltd reported that the proposal would redevelop a previously developed site, which had been vacant for some time. It was in a sustainable location, providing much needed housing, which would support the town centre.

The development would include 13 properties (4 x 3 bed and 9 x 2 bed) with 27 parking spaces. Most of the parking spaces were communal. The design was influenced by advice from the local planning authority and the conservation officer to create a pleasing street scheme fronting the highway, sensitive to the neighbouring listed buildings and following old burgage plot lines. Materials would include natural slate and stone, and timber windows and doors. Swept path analysis had been provided to ensure refuse collection could be done from the rear of the properties.

The intention was to develop this site alongside the conversion of the former Fountain Inn, which was not a financially viable project on its own.
