Investigations into the footpath at Eastern Avenue are still ongoing.

I have been in contact with various departments at Cornwall Council to ascertain their involvement in any scheme, Trees, Rights of Way, land ownership etc. and whilst there appears to be a general agreement that the project has merit I have not yet been able to gain approval for the path to

cross the Cornwall Council land, and until I can pin down specific design requirements from CC I cannot get more detailed costings.

Hi Tony

Sharon Bundy is the lead officer (details below). There appears to be a "gap" between the extent of the highway and the limit of ownership LTC/CC land - that's what she is seeking clarification for from our Legal Services team on the extent of the adoption.

This Highway budget cannot be used to support this request - although I appreciate (from the grass condition) that it is well used. So there isn't any funding I can offer.

Sharon has confirmed that it could be adopted and that standard construction must be used. The following link should be of some use:

I wonder whether you should consider street lighting given the topography.

Stopping Up of the old section of footway would be expensive (has to go to Court) – I'd recommend just leaving it as is, unless there is a burning reason to change the status. If you are worried about its ongoing use, you could have the surfacing changed (grassed for instance). Just thoughts at this point!

I will need to check on the extent of the adoption however due to the age of the site we hold little in the way of records. I am waiting to see what legal hold in the strongroom and will let you know when this arrives.

With regards to adoption providing that both CC and LTC are in agreement the path could be adopted by notice under S228 of the Highways Act once it has been built. Our standard footway construction details are on our website.
