Update since 23rd August 2016

Visitor Numbers / Sales

Visitor numbers for August were down a little on the previous year but September visitor numbers were slightly higher, over the two months we had 100 fewer visitors than in 2015. However, sales were strong and in September we had our best month for ticket sales in 14 months primarily due to the Woolly Workshops and Looe Music Festival tickets were selling. We are currently selling tickets for Plymouth Symphony Orchestra in November and Liskeard Concert Series in December.

TIC/CIC Meeting

There have been two CIC meetings in the last couple of months. The main issues discussed were: Future of the CIC – it was agreed to keep the CIC in place, it is a good way to keep all the Cornwall TICs linked and gives us the option of securing group funding and potentially bulk buying discounts in future. The Lets Go Cornwall website has effectively been closed, however, the domain will remain live and will show a map of Cornwall with links to all the TIC's own websites on it. Going forward there will be a £50pa admin charge to remain part of the Cornwall TIC CIC group, currently 12 of the 25 Cornish TICs are members of the group – Bodmin, Boscastle, Bude, Fowey, Launceston, Liskeard, Looe, Newquay, Padstow, St Austell, St Ives and Truro.

Visit Cornwall Update – both meetings were attended by Malcolm Bell of Visit Cornwall. He has acknowledged that Visit Cornwall made a mistake in moving away from the TICs when they became independent of Cornwall Council, they now see that online only marketing only works for a proportion of their customers and that face to face customer service is still very important. As such they are willing to resume working more closely with the Cornwall TICs, they have already amended their website so that there are very clear links to the local TICs websites from their homepage and have suggested that PDFs of our own leaflets/guides could be downloaded via their website.

Upcoming Visit Cornwall Events

Visit Cornwall are organising two events in the next few months to which we have been offered free places.

Marketing Workshop – up to 2 members of staff from Cornwall TICs will be invited to contribute via a workshop which will take place on 9th November, 3pm at the Visit Cornwall's Office, Roche.

Tourism Summit with various key note speakers will take place at the Royal Cornwall Showground on 2nd December. One place will be free for each Tourist Information Centre with additional guests charged at Visit Cornwall member rates.


Retail Course
